

Device to stamp out texting & motoring

A GROUP of Irish techies have invented a system that **STOPS** drivers from texting while behind the wheel.

And eggheads at Clear Sky hope their Anti-Messaging Technology will help slash road deaths.

The AMT device uses GPS tracking to check whether a phone user is trying to send a text in a moving vehicle.

If they are they'll have to punch in a series of letters, numbers and symbols within seconds.

If the data isn't recorded exactly as requested, the phone's messenger functions end.

AA Roadwatch's Conor Faughnan welcomed the system but questioned if it could be enforced.

He said: "I can't see how mobile operators would agree to extra inconveniences being put in place before you're allowed to send a text."
